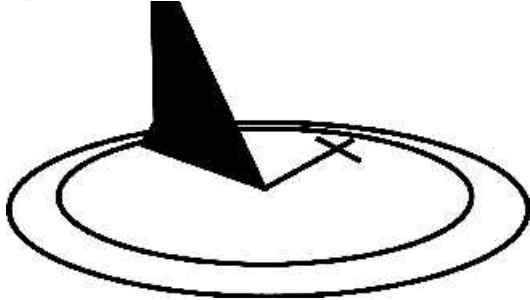

APPLICATION FOR ADULTS TO SERVE AS SMALL GROUP LEADERS AND STAFF

JUNE 26 (Sunday, 6pm) - JULY 2 (Friday, noon), 2010
Roanoke College, Salem VA

Kairos is our annual week-long faith formation event for youth who will be in 9th-12th grades in the coming fall. It is a chance for youth who are already committed to a life of faith to be part of a unique Christian community for an entire week, to have a fresh experience of the grace and presence of God in that community, and to develop habits for Christian discipleship that can be taken home as youth live out their call to be "Ambassadors for Christ." Kairos is different from our weekend events in that congregations do not send advisors with youth; the event staff serves as small group leaders and dorm advisors for the week.*

Kairos is a big commitment, but normally you are able to have a private room in the dorm and we also use dorm monitors at night so that you can get to sleep whenever you need to. Small group leaders also normally work in teams, which reduces the overall workload on one person.

If you are interested and available for serving as a small group leader, the best approach is first to contact Synod Youth Director Dave Delaney (synod office: 540-389-1000; home: 540-774-4937; cell: 540-529-6893; delaney@vasynod.org; IM screen name: dkd7s) and see if he has any instructions or questions for you. You can also contact him with any questions you may have.

This form, then, is for you to register as an adult and to indicate your interest and desire for being a leader in this community. The expectations are more clearly spelled out with you adults in mind, and you are invited to consider a set of questions slightly different from those on the youth application. If you are not a pastor or other rostered leader, I ask you to obtain your own pastor's signature. If your congregation is without a pastor, please indicate so. Thank you for responding to this call to service!

Your registration fee for Kairos is already paid, except for \$25 which we ask you to contribute to cover processing and supplies costs. If that will be difficult to do, please do not hesitate to ask for that fee to be waived as well.

*"Kairos" is the New Testament Greek word for "special time." It is used whenever God's people want to talk about a time of change, of renewal, of God's special work in the believer and the community. (This event should not be confused with the prison ministry that is also called "Kairos" or other events and ministries that share this name.)

THE KAIROS COVENANT - EXPECTATIONS OF ALL PARTICIPANTS

Following are the expectation points to which we ask all youth and adults to agree. At the end of this list is an additional set of expectations for our adult staff. In addition, each adult will need to have completed a "Small Group Leader Survey Form" prior to the event and a "permission to conduct background check" sheet for the current (2009-2010) event season.

I am aware that Kairos seeks to create an intentional Christian Community. I want to come to this event and will help build this community by honoring the expectations of this event, which include

- striving to live out the covenant God made with me in baptism
- being open to the Holy Spirit's work in deepening my faith, being open to new friendships with other Christians from around Virginia, and understanding the importance to the Kairos community of my presence and full participation in the event
- treating all members of the Kairos community as children of God, who are worthy of respect.
- attending the entire event, from Sunday evening, June 26th to Friday noon, July 2nd, attending and participating in all large group and small group sessions and worship
- agreeing to spend daily time in private reading and private writing in a journal
- remaining on the grounds of Roanoke College throughout the event
- conscientiously observing the dorm curfews and lights out times
- conscientiously observing the dorm regulation not allowing coed visitation between dorms or dorm rooms
- not bringing radios, CD / tape / mp3 players, TVs, boom boxes, computers, etc. to the event (if you need a CD player for "open mike" we will provide one for you).
- not bringing weapons, drugs, alcohol, or tobacco to the event (other than required medications)
- being aware of and refraining from actions which constitute inappropriate or unwelcome touching of others, sexual harassment, or other sexual misconduct, or suggestive or inappropriate language
- respecting the privacy and safety of all participants
- understanding that those who choose not to abide by these expectations may be asked to leave the event for the good of the community that is being created

I am looking forward to KAIROS and I sign this covenant with great hopes for the Christian Community that will be formed there. By my signature, I promise to abide by the expectations of the Kairos community.

Some additional expectations for adult staff:

- Our purpose as adults working with youth is to be Ambassadors for Christ to each other and to the youth whom we are called to serve, to build caring and supportive relationships with them, and to be examples of faith, love, and service for them. Adults should also be good examples of church commitment and Christian lifestyle.
- Adult participants at Synod Youth Events are part of a community of mutual support and should commit to show the encouragement, respect, and mutual consolation toward one another that is appropriate to such a community.
- Adult participants at youth events must abide by the same expectations as apply to the youth - including matters pertaining to alcohol, drug, and tobacco use - and be willing to follow the restrictions and requirements of the event schedule (large group times, lights out, etc.). We are permitting our adults to carry cell phones during the day in order to be able to contact Event Director Dave Delaney for emergencies, but to leave them off except for those situations.
- At Kairos, our adult staff serve as dorm monitors and advisors for the *whole community* as well as small group leaders.
- Adults working at Virginia Synod Youth Events must not have any prior history of sexual misconduct and must not engage in inappropriate touching, suggestive conversation, or other inappropriate behavior with youth. Each adult must complete a "Small Group Leader Information" sheet and a "permission to conduct background check" form.

Once your Kairos application has been received, you will receive a letter confirming your registration. It will include directions to Roanoke College, instructions on when to arrive and where to check in, and a list of things to bring with you. If you do not receive a letter of confirmation within 3 weeks of sending in your application, or at least 2 weeks before the event begins, contact the Virginia Synod Office immediately! (540-389-1000)

Throughout the spring, Synod Youth Director Dave Delaney will send out periodic updates on the planning process, the theme, and other tidbits about leading at Kairos. Then, about 3 weeks before the event, the Small Group Leader Guide for the week will be distributed to leaders and staff, along with a first draft of small group leader teams.
