


Crossword Puzzle

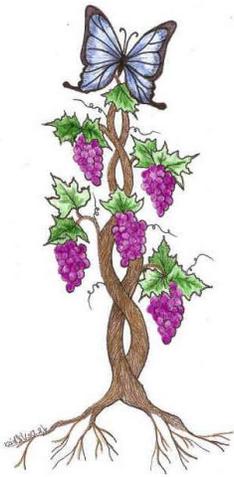



14th Sunday after Pentecost

Good morning! One of my favorite games to play is hide-and-go-seek. Have you ever played before? Have you ever played so well that you've hidden and then after a while, because the person can't find you, you actually start to make noise to make it easier for the person to find you? Let's pretend that you are playing hide and go seek with your family and you find that perfect spot where NOBODY can find you. They call your name for you to come out and you don't answer because you've fallen asleep because it took so long! Do you think they'd just give up and go out for ice cream without you or do you think they would keep looking? See, all along, you know where you are - so, it's not like you are lost - but you are separated from your family. Which means you're not with the people you're supposed to be with and that's why you would be thought of as "lost" in this "you are super-good at hiding in hide-and-go-seek" story.

In our gospel lesson from Luke this morning, Jesus talks about a lost coin and a lost sheep. The coin and the sheep are not with the person to whom they belong. The woman and the shepherd keep trying to fix that; they continue to look. They don't give up. And, once the woman and shepherd are successful in getting the coin and sheep back with them, there is great rejoicing. This same thing sometimes happens to us with God. We sometimes we stop paying attention to God because we are paying attention to something else. Then we forget that we belong to God; that is how we get separated from God and "lost." But here's the good news... when we're feeling separated from God, God doesn't ever forget about us or lose sight of us. One way that God continues to tell us that we belong to God is through each other. That's one of the reasons we gather in worship every week, to remind each other that we are not lost - that we belong to God. Then, when we remember that we belong to God and start paying attention to God again, there is great rejoicing! ALL of us belong to God, everyone one of us is God's beloved child. *adapted from rfour.org*
