


Crossword Puzzle



Good morning! In our Gospel lesson from Luke, we heard about a group of people called the Sadducees. They were Jewish people who believed that there was no life after death. Is that what we Lutherans believe? (allow for answers) No! We know that God is preparing a place for us in heaven and when we die, we will be with Jesus.

Jesus told the Sadducees that God's children are raised up to new life when they die and that our life in heaven with Jesus is a brand new beginning. Look at this plant. How would you describe it? (allow for answers) It's green, it has roots and leaves. You can clearly see that this plant is alive, right? But, how about these seeds? They are hard and lifeless. What do you think would happen if we had a funeral for these seeds and we buried them in the ground? Do you think they would grow? We might see life springing from what appeared to be dead! Just like outside. Leaves are falling, our grass and flowers are turning brown, but will it look like that forever? No! Come Springtime, new leaves will bud, the trees and grass will turn green again and brand new flowers will pop up. In the same way with us Christians, we know that death is not the end, it's just a for now. With Jesus, we will live forever.
