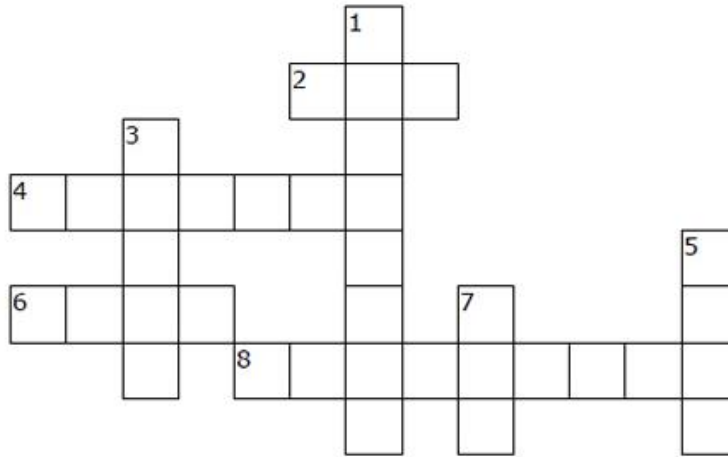


Crossword Puzzle

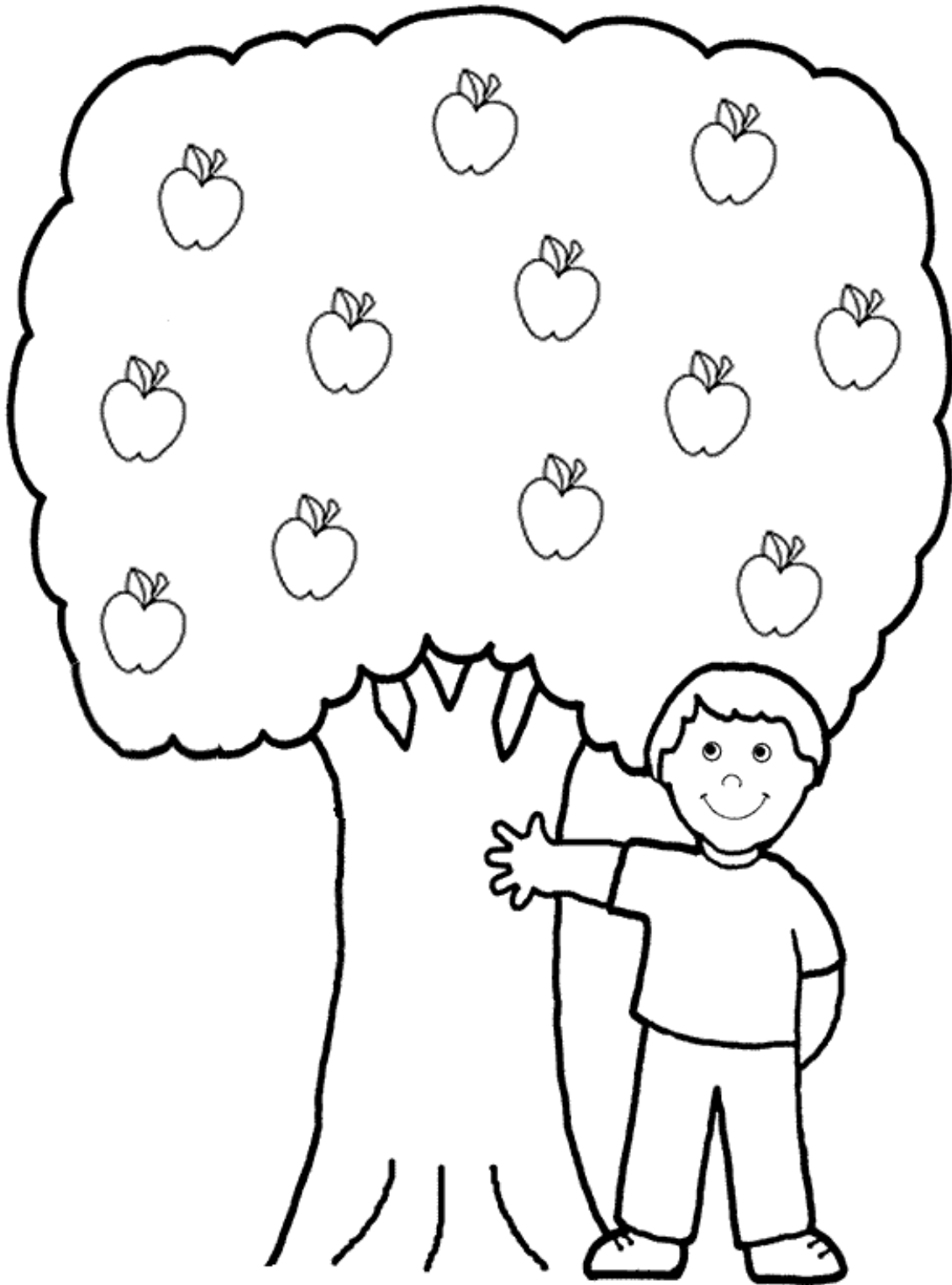

Our Gospel lesson from Luke today tells us that one day Jesus was with his disciples in the temple. The disciples were commenting on how beautiful the temple was when Jesus began to tell them about some things that were going to happen. He told them that the temple would one day be destroyed and that there would be wars, earthquakes, and people starving. He also told them that they were going to be hated and even thrown into prison. Those are scary things, aren't they? It would be understandable for the disciples to be afraid, but Jesus told them not to be afraid.
