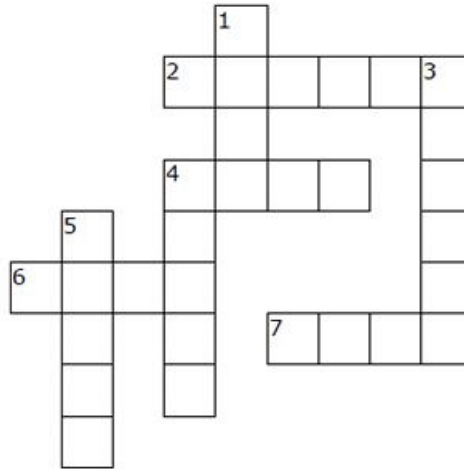


# Crossword Puzzle

## *Fourth Sunday after Epiphany*

Good morning friends! Can anyone tell me what a recipe is? (allow for answers) Today, I have a recipe for a tasty snack.

Did you know that Jesus gave us a recipe for living a happy life? In our gospel lesson from Matthew, it says, "Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them."

What did he teach them? He taught them a lesson which we call "The Beatitudes." Each one of the beatitudes starts with the words, "Blessed are they. . ." Some translations of the Bible use the word happy instead of blessed. Let's see what Jesus said about what is needed for a happy life full of God's blessings.

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted.
- Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.
- Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be filled.
- Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.
- Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.
- Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God.
- Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

You may think that some of those things that Jesus taught sound pretty difficult, and you are right. Even when you have a recipe, it may be difficult to follow, but if you follow the instructions, you can be assured of a good outcome. Jesus did not promise that life would always be easy, but he did say if we follow the teachings in today's lesson, we can be assured that we will receive God's blessing and we will be happy indeed!

Gracious God, we thank you for the teachings of Jesus. Even though life may not always be easy, we know that if we follow what Jesus taught, we will be blessed. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.
