


# Crossword Puzzle

### *Second Sunday After Epiphany*

Good morning friends! Have you ever gone on a scavenger hunt? A scavenger hunt is a game where you look for something that represents the clue you are given. For instance...if I say to you, find something in the sanctuary that represents light, you might say candles or a banner that has a picture of the sun, (or The Son), or a light bulb. Can you find me something that represents God? (allow for answers) How about the cross....or the people....or the Bible? You knew what you were looking for because I gave you a clue.

In our gospel lesson from Matthew this morning, the disciples in this story had never met Jesus, but when he said "Come and see," they went with him. They knew right away that Jesus was special. He was different than everyone else.

Jesus asked the disciples, "What are you looking for?" The disciples had been looking for a teacher, and when they found Jesus, they knew that they had finally found him. Jesus was the Messiah, which is a special person sent by God to help everyone in the world. The way the disciples learned was by following him, listening to him, and watching how he treated others. That is why instead of answering his question, he said "Come and see." That's how we learn from Jesus, too. We read about the things he did and the things he said.

Jesus wanted to teach the disciples how to follow God and love other people. Jesus also wants to teach us and help us love each other better. We just have to listen to Jesus and follow his example. \*adapted from Faith at Home
