


Crossword Puzzle

BORN AGAIN

Second Sunday in Lent

Object: a real baby or a picture of you as a baby

Good morning friends! How many of you know who this is (show baby or pic of baby...allow for answers). What a cute baby!!! Do any of you remember being a baby? Let me ask you this question...is it possible for this baby to be born again? Can this baby go back to the hospital and have another born day? NO! That would be strange!

In our Gospel story from John today, someone was confused by this concept, because he heard that he should be "born again." There was a man named Nicodemus, and he worked for the church. He was probably pretty important. He had heard about Jesus and wanted to ask Him some questions about who He was and what He was doing. He came to Jesus at night time and started asking Him how He was doing the things He did.

Jesus told Nicodemus that he needed to be born again, and Nicodemus had a hard time understanding that. Was he supposed to shrink down and become a tiny baby all over again? How could that happen? Jesus explained that this was a different kind of birth. We have physical bodies and physical birth, but being born again happens through the Holy Spirit. (Move to the font) We receive the Holy Spirit when we are baptized, right here in this wonderful, life-giving water. In this water, we receive the gift of salvation which means we get to live forever with God.

So, we're not really "born again", but, in our baptism, we become a new creation, a member of the Body of Christ as we live our lives for Jesus. What a wonderful gift God has given to us!

Loving God, in the waters of baptism, you send to us the power of the Holy Spirit who brings us the gift of faith. Thank you for loving us and for your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.
